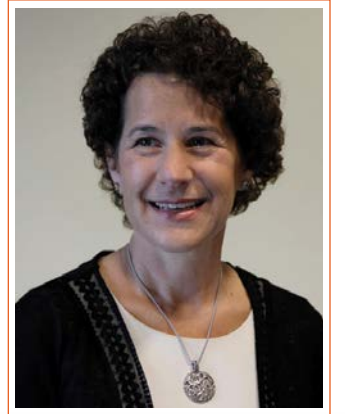

Pediatric Dental Center

KIDSPRAY PARTNERSHIP

Brooker Memorial has partnered with KidsPlay Children's Museum in Torrington to create a fun and educational dental exhibit. The exhibit mimics Brooker's pediatric dental center. There is a reception desk where kids pretend to answer the phone, make appointments, and check patients in and out. Northwest Corner Dental Partners donated an exam chair for the exhibit and we reupholstered it in bright purple. A mirror above the chair encourages children to look up at their teeth. A popular feature of the exhibit is a five foot long anatomically correct tooth



sculpture that kids can explore and climb on. For the educational aspect of the exhibit we created a display showing how much sugar is in popular beverages. The exhibit is a work in progress. Still to come are museum quality animal skulls showing tooth anatomy along with posters, educational flip boards and photos of children from our dental center. Early feedback from the museum staff indicates the children love the exhibit.

OLIVER WOLCOTT HEALTH SERVICE PROGRAM

In November 2017 Dental Hygienist Debra Ravlin and Program Manager Lisa Ferris visited Oliver Wolcott Technical School in Torrington. They spoke to senior students in the Health Services Program about employment opportunities in the dental field such as dentist, dental hygienist, dental assistant and dental administrator. Lisa and Debra discussed other dental related careers such as insurance, sales,

research, teaching, consultation and public health. Requirements and starting salaries for each position were outlined and the students were told about schools of higher education that offer dental programs in Connecticut. The students were very attentive and asked excellent questions. Following the presentation, 12 of the students came to Brooker over five days to shadow the dental team.

ROAD TRIP

Brooker Dental is fortunate to have strong working relationships with many area dental and medical



providers that enhance care for our patients. We refer our patients as needed to oral surgeons, orthodontists and endodontists and we receive patient referrals from local pediatricians, obstetricians, general dentists and schools. To show our appreciation to these offices our dental staff spent a day bringing treats and greetings to UCONN Pediatric Dental Clinic, CCMC Pediatric Dental Clinic, The Kane St. Dental Clinic in West Hartford, Pediatric Dental Center of Avon, Litchfield Hills Pediatrics, Litchfield County Pediatrics, Torrington/Winsted Pediatrics, Dr. Joel Markowski, Dr. Curi and Dr. Magda, and Danbury Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeons in New Milford. It was wonderful to meet and chat with the people we speak with regularly over the phone. We all share in the challenges and rewards of taking care of the dental needs of so many children!

MISSION OF MERCY

On April 20, 2018, the Brooker Dental staff and administrators participated in the CT Mission of Mercy free dental clinic. This year's event was held at Torrington High School. The Mission of Mercy project operates throughout the United States and provides free dental care to the underserved, uninsured and underinsured. The Torrington clinic was open to Connecticut residents on Friday and Saturday from 8 am to 4 pm. 708 patients from throughout the state traveled to Torrington and were seen over the two-day event. Organizers reported \$565,794 in donated care was provided by 828 dental/medical and community volunteers. There were people lined up in front of the high school as early as 4 am. Volunteers provided them with solar blankets, hot coffee, water and some healthy snacks. People who attended the clinic were thankful for the services that were provided and the volunteers who made the event possible. The staff from Brooker Memorial met a special little boy "Rocky" at the Mission of Mercy. Rocky became a patient at our dental center. He loved coming for his visits and always had a big smile. Rocky's mom was grateful for the exceptional care he received at Brooker Pediatric Dental Center. At Rocky's dental visit in June he brought Dr. Bahar a special thank you gift because he was going back to China with his family. We will miss Rocky's smiling face.



SUPPORTING HURRICANE VICTIMS IN TEXAS

In August 2017 parts of Texas were devastated by a category 3 hurricane. To help with the clean-up and recovery, Brooker Memorial joined the United Way of Northwest Connecticut and the Northwest Connecticut Chamber of Commerce to collect supplies and ship them to the hurricane victims. Brooker donated cases of toothbrushes, toothpaste and floss.



WELCOME TO OUR NEW DENTISTS

In August 2017, Brooker Dental welcomed Dr. Bahar Houshmand to our practice. Dr. Bahar received her Doctor of Dental Surgery from the University of Washington. She then followed her passion for working with children and completed her residency in pediatric dentistry at the University of Connecticut Health Center. In the spring, we welcomed Dr. Gordon Holder to our staff. Dr. Holder works at Brooker two Saturdays each month in addition to his full time work as Dental Director at the Community Health & Wellness Center of Greater Torrington. Dr. Holder received his D.D.S. from Howard University in Washington, D.C. He also holds a Master's in Public Health from the University of Connecticut.

Child Care & Early Learning Center

PROMOTING HEALTHY EATING

The Child Care Center enjoyed its 6th year of organic gardening with the children. Volunteers, children and staff have harvested a large variety of produce over the years, and at times we have had an overabundance. The children's tradition has been to package the extra produce and offer it for families to take home at the end of the day. We place a small table near the child care exit for families to "shop" from our free farmers market on their way out. This year, thanks to generous donations received for the garden, we were able to purchase a small glass front refrigerator to store



produce for parents. We can now display the packaged produce along with recipes for using it, and ensure that the vegetables are not wilted and dry by pick-up time. We hope to encourage families to cook together and eat more veggies!

PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

Professional development is an important component of our ongoing commitment to quality. Teaching staff participate every year in continuing education to further their knowledge and to stay abreast of best practices and new developments in the field of early childhood. Some of this year's topics included: Grief and Young Children, Play Therapy, Strategies for Supporting Students with Autism, Temperament

and Learning Styles, Culturally Competent Communication, and Creating Life Long Learners.

DANCE PARTNERSHIP

In October of 2017 a partnership was formed with The Center for Dance Arts. Owner and instructor Yvonne Donaghy used space at Brooker to run a pilot dance program on Saturday mornings for children with special needs. The "DanceAdvantage" class was designed specifically for students with autism, Down Syndrome, developmental, or intellectual disabilities, and was very well received. Miss Yvonne also provided a dance education program to interested preschoolers enrolled in our child care center. Offered weekly on Friday mornings, the program included dance, use of rhythm sticks, scarves, beanbags, and more to teach movement and rhythm. The partnership allowed children to participate in dance class at a reduced fee on a weekday while the children were at Brooker. Families appreciated the convenience of not having to enroll in a weekend or evening dance class. Two sessions have been held so far, and we look forward to continuing the program.

KINDERGARTEN READINESS FAIR

The 11th Annual Kindergarten Readiness Fair was held on March 24, 2018. The event is aimed at Torrington children who will be entering Kindergarten in the fall. It provides an opportunity for children and families to meet teachers, get information about their school, participate in crafts, activities and a raffle. Families take home hands-on activity ideas to help support early literacy, math, fine and gross motor skills to further their child's readiness for Kindergarten. Brooker continues to be a supporting partner for this event. Our pediatric dental center provides free screenings at the fair, we provide staff volunteers to help throughout the event, and this year Brooker donated two children's bicycles and helmets as raffle prizes. We are proud to participate in events such as this that help "prepare children for life long success."

COMMUNITY PARTNERS

All the staff at Brooker are committed to collaborating with community organizations to provide needed services to families. Part of this commitment is working together to solve problems as they arise. Though not an uncommon occurrence, the following shows one of our partner's appreciation for our efforts:

Community Outreach & Partner Programs

ENHANCED PARTNERSHIP STRENGTHENS THERAPY PROGRAM

Brooker and EdAdvance have worked together over the past five years in the development and provision of pediatric developmental therapies through our partner program The Center for Children's Therapy. Located at Brooker and operated by EdAdvance, the center has been meeting an important need for these services in the northwest corner. The program has experienced growth each year seeing more children and providing more hours of therapy. However, low insurance reimbursement for therapy sessions has put significant financial strain on the program. In July of 2018, Brooker became a more active partner in the program.



As such, Brooker is providing EdAdvance rent-free use of the therapy gym, treatment rooms and offices, marketing assistance and administrative support for the program. The goal of this enhanced partnership is long-term sustainability of the program. In the last year, The Center for Children's Therapy treated 136 different children providing 1,293 hours of therapy. The program employs nine therapists who provide occupational therapy, speech and language therapy and physical therapy. The majority of the patients seen are insured by Husky, though private insurance is also welcomed. Patients came to the center from seven Litchfield County towns and one town outside the county. Patients are referred by physicians and school districts and many families seek out our services on their own.

GRANDPARENTS RAISING GRANDCHILDREN

Last year, Brooker Memorial received a \$5,000 grant from the Western CT Area Agency on Aging to further

develop the Grandparents Raising Grandchildren program. We first developed a Resource Directory that was completed last summer. The grant paid for staff time to develop a call-in center "warm line" for grandparents and a brochure introducing the program to community members. A second \$5,000 was awarded to Brooker to continue the program into 2018. Eleven grandparents have actively participated in the program. They have utilized the call-in center, one-to-one resource sessions and "Lunch and Learn" events. We look forward to continuing to serve this growing population.

OVER THE EDGE

Executive Director Cathy Coyle was one of the first to sign up to go "Over the Edge" to support the Chamber's Education Foundation, Prime Time House and The Northwest CT Arts Council. Cathy raised \$1,200 in pledges and on Sept. 16, costumed as the Tooth Fairy (to represent our Pediatric Dental Center of course), she and 40 others rappelled 111 feet down the side of the Torrington Towers. Many Brooker employees and board members sponsored Cathy and came to the event to cheer her on!

YOUTH TRANSITIONAL LIVING AND MATERNITY HOME GRANT

Over the past four years Outreach Director Jan Lyon has led a community collaboration of child and family service professionals concerned with how to reach young pregnant and parenting women, many of whom are homeless or in unstable housing. Through this group,

a model program was researched and designed. The model responds to the traumas these young women and children experience and works toward the social emotional development needed to educate and train young mothers to care for their children. Child and family partner agencies would provide programs in the home, which would provide 24/7 staffing to 8 women at a time, 18 to 22 years of age, and their children. In February of 2018, a federal request for proposal (RFP) to serve this population was announced. Brooker asked FISH to become involved as the program operator and grant applicant. The Brooker and FISH Boards agreed to work together to further develop the pieces necessary to make the model a reality. More than 350 hours of writing and collaboration time went into the 75 page application to the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services Administration. The announcement of awards will be in early Fall 2018. If the grant is received, the collaborative will look to procure a suitable location to run the program.

FIT TOGETHER

Brooker Memorial continued to support and provide space for Fit Together, an initiative of Charlotte Hungerford Hospital (CHH), Center for Youth and Families, the NW YMCA and Brooker Memorial. The 8-week sessions provide parents and children a healthy nutrition and movement program to build a healthy life style. This past year Fit Together conducted three sessions for 13 families including 24 children ages 6-14. With its recent affiliation with Hartford HealthCare, Charlotte Hungerford Hospital announced its continued financial commitment to this program and other community health initiatives. CHH also promoted

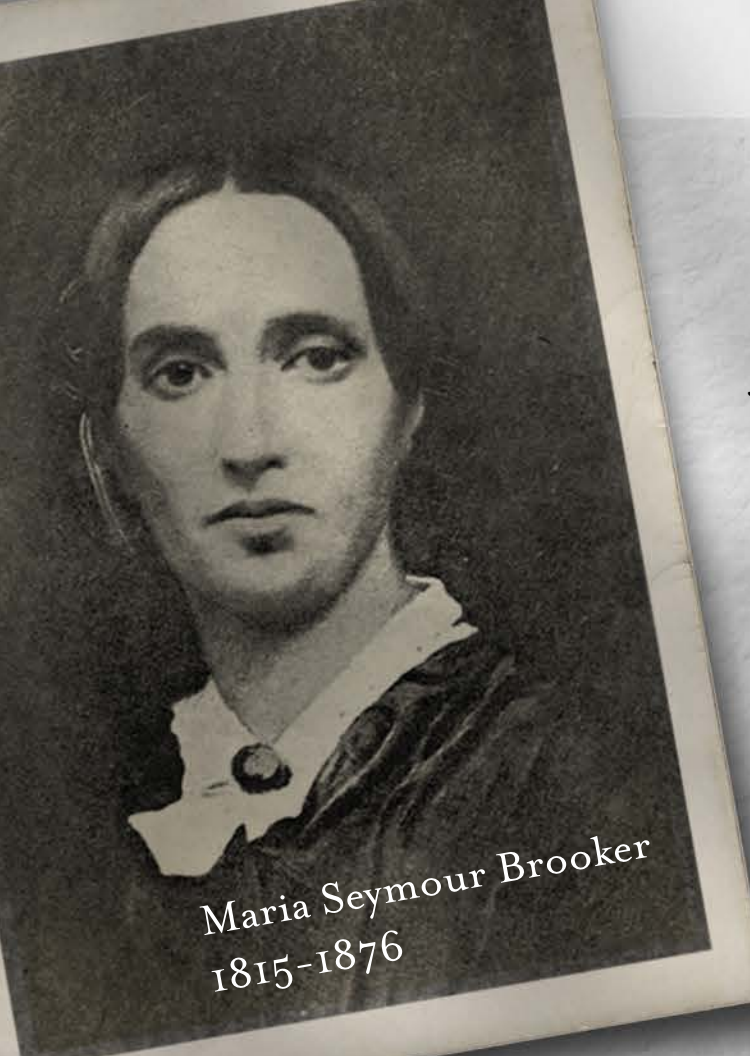

Special thanks to the committee for their hard work and to everyone who attended the events to make our 100th Anniversary successful and memorable.

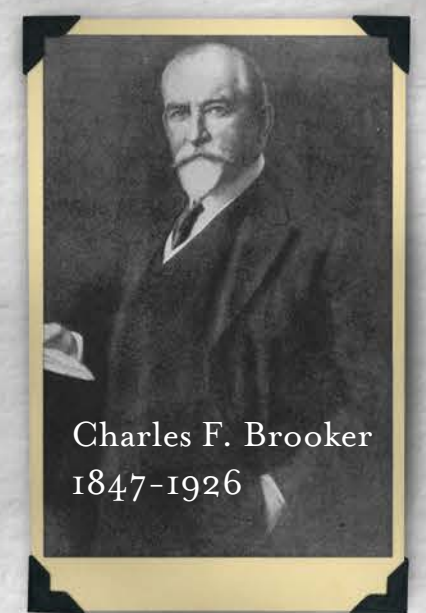

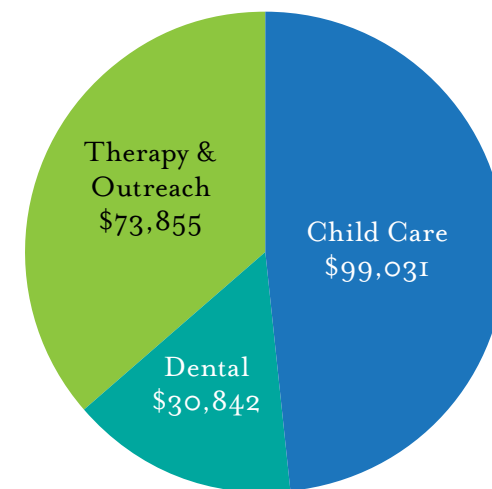
